#### **Giving Voice to the Voiceless**

We at Tucker's House have a core belief that drives us in everything we do. We believe that every child should have the ability to feel at home. We manifest this belief in our specific mission to partner with families who have children with disabilities to make their homes safer and more accessible. However, there is a myriad of ways to carry out that belief in our communities to people of every ability, race, gender, or any other qualifier you choose. We are all God's children. We are all neighbors. We should all feel at home.

We have heard quite a bit in our culture lately about giving voice to those that are marginalized or underrepresented in our communities. Children with disabilities certainly fall in this category and our organization was founded to help give a voice to these often voiceless in our society. We also give voice to these special families who often struggle in their homes in silence. We are proud to advocate on their behalf to help them receive the help they need to make their homes places of respite instead of a place filled with difficulty, struggle, and danger.

Tucker's House is a 501(c)3 non-profit that serves the Middle Tennessee area. Tucker's House was founded in 2009 by Sunny Rosanbalm who has a grandson named Tucker who has Cerebral Palsy. When Tucker was 3 ½ years old she began to see the struggles that her son and daughter-in-law were having in their home with lifting and bathing Tucker.


She started looking in the community to find resources for families who have a child with disabilities to make necessary home modifications. She found absolutely nothing and after significant prayer and research, she decided to start Tucker's House. Sunny was uniquely qualified to start Tucker's House because of her background in architectural design and working with her husband who is a General Contractor.

12 years later Tucker's House has grown from a one-woman show to a team of 5 with an operating budget of over \$500,000. Even amid the pandemic last year we were able to serve 43 families, complete 130 home projects, and create \$611,702 value of impact to the community. The mission that God placed on her heart has grown into something bigger than she could have imagined and has become quite the legacy for Tucker. Sunny also reflects that "it is also a legacy for all the children we serve. It's been these families and these children all along the way who have taught us what this community needs."

I joined Tucker's House in April of 2020 as the new Executive Director for the organization. As Sunny was looking to transition to be more involved in the life of Tucker and her other grandchildren, she says that God woke her up in the middle of the night with the thought that I should be the next Executive Director to lead Tucker's House in the next phase.







I see Mikayla in the faces of the families that we serve and I bring her to work with me every day in the work that we do. I may not be with her physically on this earth any longer but I know she is here spiritually us in our mission. Our family has a tradition of ending every prayer time by asking Mikayla to pray for us in heaven and I seek to make her proud with our efforts at Tucker's House. I am proud to be a part of the legacy of Sunny and Tucker at this great organization.

If you are inspired to get involved with our mission we would love to connect with you and engage you in our mission. The average cost of our projects is \$14,000 so we are always in need of funding or donated labor and materials to help keep our costs down. 

#### **5 Tips for Seniors to Boost Their Immune System**

The human body's immune system is a sophisticated defense mechanism designed to protect against infection and disease. The effects of aging cause the body to produce fewer white blood cells and T-cells, and thus seniors do not have as robust of immune systems as younger age groups. #### **Sufficient Vitamin D Intake**

Even before the advent of modern medicine, Vitamin D was used as a natural remedy to fight off infection and disease. Several examples include 19th century tuberculosis

patients who were placed in the sunlight for extended periods of time, or Bangladeshi children with rickets who were fed cod oil.

You might be wondering, what are the best ways to increase your Vitamin D intake? Easy, sunlight creates Vitamin D from cholesterol in your skin cells, so be sure to go outside several times a day, for at least 20 minutes at a time. There is also a plethora of healthy foods naturally packed with Vitamin D including salmon, cod fish oil, sardines, egg yolks, and mushrooms.

#### **Regular and Appropriate Exercise**

There is a theory that strenuous physical activity actually lowers the immune system's ability to fight infection and disease. Strenuous activities include exercises like high-intensity interval training (HIIT) and marathon running. There are conflicting studies both supporting and refuting this claim, so on the safe side we recommend sticking to a mixture of moderate to slightly vigorous cardiovascular activity, just to be safe. This mixture of aerobic activity improves metabolic health, produces anti-inflammatory cellular effects, and increases white blood cells and depletes pathogens. Combined, these factors help to boost the immune system in the human body.

#### **Get Adequate Rest and Sleep**

One debunked myth is that lack of sleep will cause you to get sick. This is not exactly true. How sleep interacts with your immune system is very complex. In a nutshell, lack of sleep lowers your immune system, thereby making it



more likely for viruses and infections to not only enter your body, but also lowering recovery time. How much sleep should the average senior be getting? According to Live Science, seniors need approximately 7.5 hours of sleep per night, whereas younger people need closer to 9 hours. A 2016 study by Centers for Disease Control and Prevention found that more than a third of American adults are not getting enough sleep on a regular basis.

#### **Proper Nutrition**

Our immune system is supported naturally by the foods we eat, especially those rich in vitamins, anti-inflammatories, and antioxidants. A general rule when trying to boost your immune system is to stick to a diet packed with

fruits, raw or lightly cooked vegetables, and lean proteins. There are many resources out there online to see these diets.

#### **Lower Your Stress Levels**

The link between mental health and the immune system is perhaps the most fascinating of all the topics we will covered. The notion that we have a degree of control over our immune system by simply limiting our stress levels displays the power the human brain has over the body, is startling to most people. Stress reduces the body's ability to produce T-cells and gamma interferon, thus making us more susceptible to viruses and infections. Limiting stress will improve your immune system response.

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#### **Looking for Silver Linings In A Year We Would Like To Forget**

It is believed that Shakespeare wrote some of his best works including King Lear and Macbeth while he was in quarantine from the plague in the 1600s. A few years later, Isaac Newtown self-isolated from the plague in an old farmhouse in northern England where he invented calculus and pondered a theory of gravity while watching apples fall from a tree.

As we now appear to be emerging, at last, from an experience that only comes along once in a hundred years, are there any silver linings for which we can give thanks? Here are perhaps a few:

- **1. A Lesson In Endurance.** As a nation of survivors, we have demonstrated once again that the human spirit is capable of enduring shared hardship and tragedy. Like the generations before us who suffered through the Great Depression and world wars, we too now have some lessons to pass along to our children's children about God's faithfulness in the midst of tribulation.
- **2. Strength Through Isolation.** Throughout the pandemic we witnessed examples of those who lay aside their personal wellbeing to care for those who were vulnerable. Whether you refrained from hoarding groceries to leave enough for others in the community, or offered to run errands for shut-ins afraid of

leaving their homes, there is one thing that coronavirus has taught society: to take notice and reach out to those in need.

- **3. Reinforcing Family Ties.** According to one Pew Research survey, one third (33%) of Americans mentioned positive impacts to their relationships with spouses, children or other family members who no longer have to spend their days at work or school. The Institute for Family Studies reports that teenagers got more sleep, felt closer to their parents and had a more positive outlook on life in 2020 than in 2018. Fifty-six percent of teens reported spending more time talking with their parents during COVID than before
- **4. Slowing Down The Pace of Life.** Albert Camus once said: "In order to understand the world, one has to turn away from it on occasion." For many of us, the pandemic allowed us to an opportunity to reflect on gifts and relationships we may have taken for granted.
- **5. Necessity As The Mother of Warp Speed Invention.** The passion and urgency with which the scientific and medical communities came together globally to produce safe and workable vaccines for the COVID pathogen is nothing short of miraculous. It now appears that the innovative medical discoveries

gained through the race for a safe, effective vaccine produced unexpected significant insights into ways to curtail the spread of other highly contagious viruses.

**6. Testing Positive For Resiliency.** People of all ages have proven that they are resilient. They have been able to adapt and pivot to new ways of managing their lives and embrace the incredibly abrupt shifts required as pandemic restrictions have grown and changed. In the legal profession, attorneys found ways through virtual meetings, Zoom depositions and court hearings and other forms of technology to continue representing clients in need. Surprisingly, even those who were intimidated by this technology before the pandemic came to embrace it.

We are careful not to demean the seriousness of the pandemic and the toll it took on human life with platitudes. Several thousand families in the U.S. still mourn the loss of a friend or loved one. At the same time, we may honor those whom we have lost by pausing to give thanks and acknowledging God's faithfulness in the midst of the storm.



Iconic multi-platinum, singer and songwriter Michael W. Smith announced he will be re-recording and re-releasing his #1 highest-selling album of all time, Worship, in honor of the 20th anniversary of the album's release on September 11, 2001. Worship Forever will re-imagine the album from start to finish, this time, with a full symphony

Worship Forever will be recorded in front of a live audience at Allen Arena on July 12, 2021 in Nashville, Tenn. and released on September 10, 2021. The one-of-a-kind evening will also be released as a television event later this year. Michael W. Smith has been releasing new music regularly and performing around the world to sold-out crowds for the last 35+ years. During his storied





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

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#### **Ask The Expert**

Q: What is the maximum amount a beneficiary of a Special Needs Trust (SNT) can have in a personal checking account?




**A:** If the beneficiary (person living with a disability) is receiving government benefits, the amount of money in the person's checking account should not exceed \$2,000, at the end of each month. If the amount is higher than this, the beneficiary's benefits can be affected. If the beneficiary is not receiving government benefits and will not be applying for benefits in the near future, there is no maximum amount.






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#### **Dads- Your Kids Need You**

Loving and leading your children in a broken world requires conviction and courage. On the Bridges set I have listened to many

stories about fathers. Sadly, the absence of a father – or the presence of an immature fathers present giant-sized challenges for children. Here is a quote about Fatherhood from one of America's most loved and respected Evangelists. "A good father is one of the most unsung, unpraised, unnoticed, and yet one of the most valuable assets in our society." Billy Graham

Research shows that children with good fathers in the home are more likely to grow into strong and confident adults. In everything from reading scores to problem solving, children with capable, present fathers are more likely to succeed. Of course, that does not mean that children without a father figure in the home are destined to fail. Thankfully, good moms, pastors, caring teachers, and others in our community can also impact our children in many valuable ways.

As we celebrate Father's Day this month let us be quick to applaud the men that are intentional about parenting. After all it's not easy to meet children's needs. Their needs come in all shapes and sizes. With the help of Christ though –you have got all the strength you need to help your children grow and fulfill God's plan for their life.

Over the last 25 years I have conducted over 4000 interviews and there are some shows that really leave a lasting impression. One of the stand-out interviews was one I did in honor of Father's Day. I was interviewing a

father and his adult son. They are both pastors and it was clear to me that the relationship they share was very special and built on God's love.

The adult son made a comment that I will remember and hold in my heart forever. Here is what he said: "My father was such a good example and role model that he never did anything that caused me to question Christianity."

#### **Secrets Of The Strong Start To Losing Weight**


Ever wanted to know the techniques and tricks used by those who successfully lost weight, and kept it off? Thanks to a survey conducted by weight loss site SparkPeople we have some road-tested tips to give you the best chance at managing weight.

- **Track Food and Calories** Both strong and false starters ranked "food tracking" as the one action that made the biggest difference in their programs. 82% of strong starters tracked food every day vs. 65% of false starters, and strong starters were twice as likely to track their calories.
- **Don't put certain foods off limits** Strong starters were less likely to label foods "good" or "bad" and forsake certain foods, and were three times more likely to use portion control techniques that supported consumption of unhealthier foods in moderation.
- **Spend LESS time exercising** On average, strong starters exercised for 30 minutes during the first two weeks; false starters for 60 minutes, suggesting that false starters burned themselves out.
- **Focus on both diet and exercise** 74 percent of false starters made both fitness and dietary changes from the outset, compared to 50 percent of false starters.
- **Engage more with others/have a support network –** Strong starters were more than twice as likely to communicate with other members online.
- **Weigh yourself weekly, not daily –** Most strong starters weighed themselves weekly, while the majority of false starters did so daily.
- Focus first and foremost on developing healthy habits, not losing weight Most strong starters viewed their #1 goal as "building a strong foundation of healthy habits." A majority of false starters made losing 3-4 pounds in their first two weeks their #1 goal, which backfired.

Of course, another big help in weight loss is accountability and NOT going it alone! I attribute my weight loss success to Dr Lodge and the staff at Cool Springs MD. #### **5 Ways to Pack Your Faith This Summer Vacation**



#### The Epic Life

Did you know that when you became a Christian, your Spirit became a new species of being – not your flesh and not your soul? We are made up of three parts – body (flesh), soul (emotions) and spirit.

Second Corinthians 5:17 states that when we come to know Christ, we become a new person. The old life is gone, and a new life has begun. However, your outward appearance remains the same. Neither your flesh, nor your thoughts change initially. It is only after we learn to walk by our "spirit" that the flesh and soul begin to change.

It has been said that we are a Spirit, we have a soul, and we live in a body. Through the ages, our patriarchs of faith have tried to explain and describe exactly what it means to become a Christian – Christ-like - when our body (flesh) seems to behave contrary. Paul talks about this conflict in Romans – the struggle is real.

One of the first things we should do when we become a Christian, is to acknowledge that we have a new Spirit. The Bible tells us that the same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead lives inside you. It is not an immature baby Spirit that is growing up – it is a fully, adult-size Spirit of God that lives within. The Word also tells us that God is a Spirit and those who worship Him must do so in Spirit. Not to say that we don't worship in our flesh, but we must acknowledge that there is more to worshipping than worshipping in our mind, will, and emotions, and more than raising our hands in Church. We acknowledge that our born-again Spirit loves to worship. If we are experiencing conflict, it is because we have chosen to let our flesh dominate instead of our Spirit.

Religion has tried to tell us that if we "act" right and do all of the "right" things, outwardly, we are a Christian when actually, we are just a manager of our sin. Acting "right" is an attempt to change us from the outside in. To be blunt – this is absurd! As a Christian, we are changed from the inside out. When we acknowledge everything, Christ has done in our spirit and we begin to renew our minds, we allow the Spirit to be in control instead of what we see, taste, hear and touch. On this side of heaven, our flesh will always be in conflict with our Spirit. The Bible tells us that the flesh is an enemy to our



Spirit. The Christian life is not about managing our sin and coping with our inconsistencies but enjoying an epic relationship with God and all that Jesus purchased on the cross for us.

To acknowledge our Spirit and see us as Christ sees us, we look to the Bible. The Word acts like a mirror (a reflection) and it tells us who we are in our Spirit, and then we walk it out through faith. When we want to know who we REALLY are – we don't look at our flesh to tell us but the Word. Philemon 1:6 tells us that we acknowledge every good thing in us. Contrary to our flesh, we are righteous, we are holy, we are mighty, we are healed, we are sanctified, we are perfect, on and on.

Once we have asked Jesus to forgive us and become a Christian, the remainder of our brand-new life is learning how to release what is already in us instead of trying to get something more added. When we realize who we are in our Spirit, renew our mind and deny our flesh – we will enjoy this epic life as a child of God and all that He has done for us!

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


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## FAMILY AND BUSINESS: A WINNING COMBINATION FOR HOBBY LOBBY'S DAVID GREEN

When Hobby Lobby's David Green and his wife Barbara host a family gathering, things can get a little crowded. The founder and CEO of the crafting and home decor giant traditionally hosts birthday gatherings each month for their family, which includes 43 children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren. They also gather for holidays at a location they like to call their "Legacy House."

"We have a house just for family get-togethers, and we celebrate every-body's birthday. We encourage them and honor them and believe me there are a lot of birthdays each month," Green said, laughing. "Family is extremely important to us, and we try to lead by example. We've done that, our kids did the same thing, and now our grandkids."

This month- as the calendar celebrates Father's Day and fathers, grandfathers, and other fatherly figures- Green stresses the importance of family in both his personal life and business

dealings. (Green will be one of the keynote presenters at the upcoming Legacy Grandparenting Summit at Shades Mountain Baptist in Birmingham, Ala. on October 21-22.)

His thoughts on family and business, in fact, can be summed up in the word "legacy." "We don't want to spend all of our time on things that are temporal," he said. "We want to make a difference for Christ, to always be in ministry."

Humble Beginnings. David and Barbara started the business that would become Hobby Lobby with just a \$600 loan from their local bank and a simple plan to make picture frames. "We were working at TG&Y and in 1970 we decided to go into business ourselves," Green recalled. "We borrowed the money and bought a miter to make frames. We opened our first store in 1972, with around 300 square feet in Oklahoma City."

Barbara noticed that women in the community were taking small frames and grouping them together on a wall; she took that small home decor inspiration and saw a need for a business to meet the trend. They shipped the frames to art and craft stores, paying their seven- and nine-year-old sons seven cents for each frame they glued together. "We opened our second store in 1975 and left TG&Y," Green said. "Barbara worked the first five years without any pay at all, and God continued to lead us. And here we are today."

Hobby Lobby today has 900 stores and is the largest privately-owned arts and crafts retailer in the world with 43,000 employees. Its corporate headquarters include more than 10 million square feet of manu-

facturing, distribution and office space in Oklahoma City. "As the years went by, we continued to be blessed by this opportunity," Green said. "And as we got older, we decided we had to follow after Christ and let Him lead us."

#### A Ministry Model of Business.

Green said that generosity and ministry are at the heart of his business plan, and he puts his "money where his mouth is." Hobby Lobby currently gives half of its earnings to ministries, and once a month, board members decide where the money will go. "We have about 300 requests a month, and we're involved in 60 or 70 ministries with five or six that get the bulk of our help," he said.

The scope of their giving impacts such groups as One Hope, which has put a billion Bibles into the hands of children; Every Home for Christ, which tasks itself to distributing the Gospel to homes around the world; and the Museum of the Bible, an interactive museum in Washington D.C. "The purpose of Hobby Lobby is ministry...to do what we can do to lead people to Christ," Green said. "That's what drives us."

The coronavirus pandemic challenged the management of Hobby Lobby and affected the livelihood of its employees. Green said that was the most difficult aspect of the changes in 2020 and 2021- the way it impacted the people who depend on Hobby Lobby. The company shut down completely in April of 2020, with a payroll of approximately \$90 million a month and \$40 million in rent. Green had to let 35,000 employees go for a period of time.

"We didn't know if we'd even survive or not and found ourselves on our knees every day asking for God's mercy and help," he remembers. "But all of our stores have been open now since mid-May of that year, and we've more than made up for our losses. It was especially nice to be able to welcome our employees back."

Green has shared his philosophy of generosity in the book *Giving it All Away...And Getting it Back Again*; it details his family's own journey toward understanding this purpose, and challenges readers to leave a legacy that goes deeper than money. "We believe it is by God's grace and provision that Hobby Lobby has endured," he said. "God has been faithful in the past and we trust Him for our future."

Green makes the same salary as he did 20 years ago, and he said that his future plans are quite simple: to earn as much money as possible in a "good and ethical" way so that the company can do more ministry. "We can't say we've arrived, while people still need to know Christ, whether it's in Hobby Lobby, or in other investments," he said.

Leaving a Legacy. That legacy of generosity and Christ-led living extends today to his family's work with the company the Greens founded. The board of Hobby Lobby includes members of the family, with son Steve serving as President, son Matt serving as Ministry Investment Officer, daughter Darsee Lett serving as Vice President of Art/ Creative, and son-in-law Stan serving as Executive Vice President.

"At every monthly board meeting we talk about who we want to be and how we want to follow after Christ," Green said. "We try to be an example in business of that. We don't always get it right, but we strive to represent Christ well." Green said that one of his

life goals comes from 1 Timothy 2:7, which says "This and this only has been my appointed work: getting the news to those who have never heard of God, and explaining how it works by simple faith and plain truth."

Another verse that rings true to Green's life and business model is Matthew 6:20-21, which encourages believers to "Store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

In the way Hobby Lobby is ministering in the world- and in his own family's influence- Green's "treasure" is obvious.

#### **The Big Stuff**

The big question that faces every individual is: Where will I spend eternity? If we put that matter off during our lifetime, the decision is made for us. We will spend eternity in Hell. If, however, we decide the "big stuff" by accepting Jesus Christ as our savior (see John 3:16), then we will spend eternity in Heaven. Big stuff, simple answer. #### Why should I get vaccinated right now?

If that happens, the vaccinations that have already been done on millions of us may end up being wasted!

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
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
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#### FAITH UNDER FIRE

#### **Use Our Platform and Honor God**

As Christians...God provides a "platform" for us to serve and honor Him. Each of us is different with talents and abilities. The question: Are we learning to know The Lord better... love Him more...serve Him better...and honor Him more? I heard someone ask. Are we content to just occupy space, breathe air and meander through our days on earth?

I am reminiscing about a late friend who discovered later in life that he had a platform to honor God. He admitted that success as the world knows it had become an obsession until God provided a dramatic miracle in his life.

Tommy Jett billed himself as "the fastest Jett to fly the skies". Tommy was a well-known and loved radio personality in Chattanooga for several decades going back to the 1960s.

He literally ruled the radio airwaves in the tristate area of Tennessee, Georgia and Alabama from WFLI Radio located on Lookout Mountain.

He was almost bigger than life; flamboyant personality, witty, charming; keen sense of music; words that captured the imagination of listeners. At live concerts and personal appearances, Tommy stood above the crowd with rings on every finger and cool shades.

My story now picks up on April 18, 2012. Tommy, an acute diabetic, was driving near Chattanooga when his blood sugar level dropped. He drove off the road. The car went airborne flipping over several times before landing in a clump of trees upside down. First responders had to extricate him from the crushed automobile before rushing to a hospital.

Tommy was placed on life support. While in a coma, a dozen doctors told his wife Charlene there was no hope. Everything was failing. She was encouraged to think about a funeral service. A suit was even picked out.

Denise, a dear family friend, bent down at his bedside and whispered, "Listen, you had better get your stuff together Buddy before they pull the plug."

God had other plans...and gave a miracle. Tommy promised The Lord that he would honor Him by giving thanks every day... and to tell others. That he did using his celebrity platform at concerts, church, radio and television programs...and to anyone who would let Tommy bend his or her ear. He was on the telephone almost every day sharing his love for The Lord and to those he called a close, personal friend; a mission that continued until Tommy's passing in the fall of 2018. I was one of those recipients of his encouraging telephone calls.

Though Tommy professed to be a Christian since he was a teenager, sometimes what we believe to be fame and success can blind us. Tommy often told me how it affected him. However, during the pinnacle of his radio success, a minister of the Gospel – Brother Eugene Coleman – along with Tommy and Larry Mason had an idea of starting The Carpenter's Cowboy Church, one



that would accommodate area entertainers and others who could not attend regular church services. Good idea...but with limited funds and no space... where?

The prayer was answered by the owner of a hotel; willing to give FREE space with a sound system in his bar. With the liquor bottles pushed aside, the church was begun. From its early beginning and continuing for two decades, Brother Coleman confirmed that over 5,000 decisions were made for Christ during services at the Cowboy Church.

Once when Tommy was traveling to do a personal appearance as a party DJ, an intense thunderstorm forced him to pull off the highway and seek shelter under a bridge. From out of nowhere, came a tap on the car window. Should he open the window...or ignore the stranger? He took a chance. Without saying a word, a homeless man gave Tommy a card that read...if you meet and forget me...you have lost nothing. But, if you meet Jesus Christ and forget Him...you have lost everything.

Tommy had an imagine of the Christian Cross tattooed on one of his arms... and also reference to the Bible promise found in 2 Chronicles 7 -- 14. The artist who sketched those tattoos is known as Big Al...who let it be known he was far from being a Believer. Tommy always reminded Big Al that he would be praying for him to know Jesus Christ as personal Savior and Lord. Big Al would shake his head and tell Tommy that it was a waste of time.

Tommy's response, "You need the prayers...and I need the practice. So I will keep on praying for you." I am not sure if Big Al came to know The Lord. But when Tommy passed from this life, Big Al asked Charlene if he could lead the funeral procession to the cemetery by riding his motorcycle.

I believe Tommy's prayers had an eternal influence on Big Al. My question: Are you and I using our platform to share The Lord and allow His Light to be reflected in and through us for others to see God's reality?

#### What About That "Innocent" Crack?

So, that foundation crack in your basement- the one you discovered last summer? You know the one: just a few inches long, barely there, probably just due to your home "settling." 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

#### **Going All In: Words from the Extended Foster Family**

#### An unexpected calling for sudden grandmas, grandpas, aunts, uncles, and cousins

When my husband and I were planning to become foster parents, we thought about many things. Bedrooms. Clearances. Applications. Agencies. Safety checks. Car inspections.

While we passed on some good tips and dutifully dialogued the extended-family-conversation starters from our pre-placement training, I never really stopped to ask, "I wonder what my parents will think when they meet these sudden grandsons?" or, "I wonder what my sister-in-law will feel the first time she holds a niece she didn't know was on the way?" This oversight reveals one of my great underestimations of the planning process, and it gives immediate family a whole new meaning.

Fortunately, our families have been very supportive through these years. They've learned a lot, too. As they near a decade of experience as foster grandparents and foster aunts or uncles, they could appear unflappable in the face of the consistent changes, ups and downs, and endless unknowns. But the truth is, no one loves a child and grows numb to these losses.

Foster mama Jamie Finn writes, "I could be sitting on the sidelines, in blissful ignorance of the brokenness that surrounds me, enjoying the whole-ness of a sweet and sheltered life. Missing out on the beauty of breaking off pieces of my heart

and my life to make another whole. Missing out on the joy of offering those broken pieces in worship to my Savior." Over the years, we have offered these broken pieces, as a family, in worship together.

In the words of our extended foster family...

#### What did you first think when we told you we were going to become foster parents?

We were thrilled at the thought of more grandchildren! I had always thought that I would have loved to adopt children, but the opportunity never presented itself. This would be a way to be a part of that as a grandparent. I thought it would be wonderful that a child will have a loving family with both a mommy and a daddy and brothers. I knew it was a huge commitment of time and energy but shows you put 'care' for children into action.

#### What perceptions did you have that later turned out to be incorrect?

Being a foster aunt turned everything I thought I knew about foster care and adoption on its head! I incorrectly assumed that foster care was quick and smooth. I thought there would be so many children in need that we would have a perfect match in our arms in days. The process for the parents turned out to be intense and the entire process took a lot more time than I had anticipated.

I thought there would be no contact with the biological parents. It was so hard to learn bits and pieces about [our foster grandson's] biological mom and her situation. I feared his future was laden with unprovided needs.

My perceptions of attachment were wrong. I thought maybe I could guard my heart and not become attached in the same way as to my biological nieces and nephews, just as selfish protection against the hurt of a child eventually leaving. I quickly learned this isn't possible; they steal your heart no matter what!

I thought foster care situations were usually in one-parent households and not from intact families as many of your placements have been. What perceptions did you have that were proven to be correct? I loved being a grandparent to every child who has come into our life. There is an abundance of love in a grandparent's heart! Not knowing if they would be permanent made it easy to be available without any expectations.



My son and daughter would rise to the occasion and do very well at accepting their foster children as their own and teaching, nurturing and valuing each life. I knew they would treasure the children. I was concerned it could be heartbreaking with the strong bonds and love attachment that forms, and it was. Our son and daughter-in-law made the right choice to foster children, and we as a family have been blessed as a result. The love we shared even for the children that did not become permanently placed with us will always have an impact on their growth and development. The early years are so critical... brain growth

occurs and must be nurtured.

#### What is one thing you wish someone would have told you before this journey started?

I never realized how much I would process a child's reunification [and leaving us] like the grief of death. I remember hearing a Christian speaker say, "Each gift is God's for his time." That is so necessary to know when grandparenting both foster, adoptive or biological grandchildren. It's not easy, but it's a reality that is part of life.

I wish someone had told me my heart would be broken when a child I considered my grandchild left us. I was surprised how many times I had dreams about him calling out "grandma" and reaching for me.

#### What is one piece of advice you would give to someone else about to become a foster grandma, grandpa, aunt or uncle?

My piece of advice to aunts and uncles would be "go all in." Don't try to guard your heart. The relationship you have with this child (however short or long) and the light they will bring to your life so far outweighs any worrisome feelings about an unknown future.

The toughest times in life do not break us – they make us stronger as we lean on Jesus, our solid rock. Love and accept the child. Esteem the child and validate the child as worth much in your eyes and in the eyes of God. Pray for your sons and daughters as they embark on this journey. Enjoy the children and attempt to fit into their lives whenever you can do so.

Pray, pray, pray... cover the foster parents in prayer, the child who is being fostered, siblings, and most of all the biological parents. Pray that the Lord's will be done, and trust that whatever happens is his will—especially when it doesn't align with what you think is right, good, or best for this child.

Offer to watch kids, make meals, and just be there. Most of all, be a good listener. You don't need to try to offer solutions or "fix" things when they are hard—and they will be!

Open your heart to this child and do not hold back because of the fear of saying goodbye. Every child needs love and acceptance, and grandparents have plenty of unconditional love!

In foster care and adoption, there are no 'ideal' outcomes; someone always experiences a loss. The calling to be foster parents is a unique one, and by saying 'yes,' we roped everyone in our family into this unpredictable cycle. The immediate aunt, the instant uncle, the sudden grandma, and the overnight grandpa are part of the whole picture of foster care that isn't always noticed.

This is my public 'thank you' to my family, and to the countless extended foster families out there. Moms, Dads, Sisters, Brothers, Cousins—I've seen your joy, I've heard your prayers, and I've watched you find more love when you thought your heart was broken. Thank you for going all in.

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
